### **Ralfonso, Geneva, Switzerland and West Palm Beach Florida**

Ralfonso is an International artist and designer of environmentally interactive, kinetic, light and sound sculptures (sculptures that interact with the environment such as wind, water, etc.) since 1980. Since 1999 he specializes in the design and execution of large to monumental kinetic and light sculptures for public places from his studios in West Palm Beach, Florida, USA and Geneva, Switzerland.

His passion in life is Kinetic Art for Public Places. With this passion, as president from its inception, he co-founded the Kinetic Art Organization (KAO) [www.kinetic-art.org](http://www.kinetic-art.org) in 2001 with a German and a US fellow Kinetic Artist. Now, with more than 1,000 members in over 60 Countries around the world, KAO has become the largest kinetic art organization in the world. KAO is an affiliate sculpture group of ISC.

All of Ralfonso's kinetic sculptures move, as they interact with water, wind and electricity, as well as with the natural environment and most importantly, the viewer. His sculpture designs range in size from 2ft. to 60ft. Ralfonso's

sculptures have been exhibited or installed in Switzerland, Netherlands, Russia, China, Germany, United Arab Emirates and the USA.

As co-founder and member of the 2013 International Kinetic Art Exhibit and Symposium and Kinetic Art Selection Committee, Ralfonso is passionate and committed to the international field of Kinetic Art.

**Rick Beau Lieu, Boynton Beach, Florida**

Artist, gallery owner and art advocate Rick Beau Lieu was one of the founding members of the City of Boynton Beach's Art in Public Places Program. Rick's years of experience as an artist, educator, art judge and most recently as an art appraisal professional have awarded him many amazing accomplishments. Founder of Beau Lieu Sculpture Studios and the driving force behind the designation of the Boynton Beach Art District, Rick owns the Neighborhood Gallery that represents over 30 artists internationally.

Rick has expanded his business to specialize in fine art appraising Old Masters, Impressionist, Modern, and Contemporary Fine Art, sculpture and paintings. We are qualified to broker, authenticate, appraise, and restore original paintings, sculpture, and prints. Other services include inventory, research, and documentation of a single item or an entire collection.

Rick has an exceptional talent to create stunning contemporary sculpture in several styles and mediums. His work ranges from smooth painted steel sculpture to modern abstract sculpture created with stainless steel and poly-chromed accents to realistic bronze castings with subtle patinas. Rick recognizes the advantages and limitations of the material he is using and exploits the medium to its full potential.

Rick's works can be seen in galleries, public buildings and institutions throughout the world. His affiliation with international art organizations and National Environmental Groups is noteworthy. In 1989, he was the recipient of the Distinguished Florida Artist of the Year Award. He also received a 1990 award for Significant Contribution to the Arts in Education from the National Organization of Young Audiences and in addition received a 1991 Resident Artist Award for his work with high school students by the Palm Beach County.

Rick has been busy since he moved to Boynton Beach from Chicopee, Mass. where he used to live and work on pieces in a much colder climate. In 1986 he received a commission from the Starkoff Associates, which resulted in two monumental sculptures being installed on the grounds of the Arvida Executive Center in Boca Raton. In 1988, another commission resulted in the production of seven sculptures of a marine or nautical theme, which were part of an underwater art exhibit to benefit The Center for Marine Conservation in Washington, D.C.

Schooled in realism, abstraction has afforded him creative license. Rick's most popular works range in size from two to twelve feet, though his Liberty, or Victory Over Communism, stands at over forty feet and weighs more than seven tons.

Rick Beau Lieu's demonstrates his commitment to the City of Boynton Beach Art in Public Places program by participating in the International Kinetic Art Exhibit and Symposium Kinetic Art Exhibit Selection Committee.
